Sadly, there is a push in Europe to privatise rail transport and focus more on profits, instead of properly funding public services for the people.

Private companies profit from public services by cutting corners and underinvesting:

- Rail networks shrink and so does your access to rail services.
- Jobs are slashed.
- The risk of accidents goes up.

That's why during the European Year of Rail, the ETF calls for Europe and national governments to:

- keep rail public
- keep on-board staff on trains
- invest in quality jobs and rail infrastructure
- keep passengers and railway workers safe.
