

The EU Commission, the EU Parliament, and the Member States are about to agree on longer days of work and shorter breaks for bus and coach drivers.

Under the current rules, coach tour drivers can be forced to drive 12 consecutive days without any day off, and in practice, a coach driver only sleeps 5 to 6 hours per night. **And here's why:**

DEEPEN DRIVER SHORTAGES ACROSS EUROPE

The sector is currently 100,000 drivers short. Only 6% of them are young people and only 16% are women. Many more are ready to leave if rules change, according to an ETF survey ran in March 2023.
